Crisfield, on the eastern shore of Mary-. land, is known (at least to its residents) as the "Crab Capital of the World," and it was here, in 1997, that Greg Cain started The Crab Place, dedicated to selling fresh Maryland crabs caught daily by local watermen. The company's Web site ships hard crabs (live and steamed), soft crabs, crabmeat (lump and claw), soup crabs (cleaned and frozen for enriching soups and



sauces), king and snow crab legs, clams, oysters, shrimp and fresh-caught fish as well as soups and salsas, including this unusual but very tasty tomato-corn salsa with crabmeat. Four
